GREENFAITH & SPLENDOR

BABMOC UPDATE

Dear Friends,

We have built and opened an elementary school in Liberia providing completely free education to 68 children who were not attending school because their parents couldn't afford the fees to send them.

One of our students is Reuben. He is in the 3rd grade, has not been to school in three years, and lost his mother in 2016. He is living with a relative of his father in the Kpelle Town community where our school is located. He told us, "With BABMOC's school, I am hopeful that my dream to become a builder is now just a matter of time."

We are currently looking to raise \$9,000 to fund the construction of a new classroom for the school to accommodate Reuben's rising fourth grade class this September. We have raised \$7,066 so far. You can help!

We are also looking for pledges to pay the tuition for Reuben and his classmates. It costs \$45 a month and \$450 per school year for each student to attend the BABMOC School. NOTICE FOR WOMEN

(Especially women who have some available time in the afternoon!)

Covenant's daytime Circle, known as Friendship Circle, meets Tuesday afternoon at 1:30 on the second Tuesday of each month from September to May. We tend to be the women who no longer choose to venture out in the evenings. We want you to know that any woman even remotely connected with Covenant Presbyterian Church is welcome to join us. We are a nifty group of women and you might enjoy getting to know us and participating in our study and fellowship and service.

We have light refreshments as we gather and catch up on the news—ours and other people's; we send cards of love and concern to people whom we think might need or want a special remembrance; we read the bible and study a lesson from the Horizons Bible Study which is lovingly and carefully prepared by the Presbyterian Women of PC(USA). This (2018-19) year's study is, "GOD'S PROMISE - I am with you". The study is designed to combine what we know with new ideas and to provide challenging ways of thinking. The discussion will be more interesting if you are with us.

This year, we are adding a new feature. During each meeting, we will learn about a saint (as designated by the Roman Catholic Church). We think of these people as saints, too, but often we know little about them. Until Vatican 11, we Protestants tended to avoid anything connected with the Roman Catholic Church but now we are more open to looking at how other people encounter God. The saints can be fascinating. The Rev. Pat Willard will lead this part of our afternoon discussion. We will study women, beginning with Saint Hildegard. Hildegard lived about the middle of the Christian times and will be an interesting start. Afterwards we will go backward and forward to cover different times during the past 2100 years.

May 10, 2012

Pope Benedict XVI has formally declared that Hildegard of Bingen is a canonized saint.

Although she has been revered as a saint for centuries, and several Roman Pontiffs have referred to her by that title, the process of canonization was never officially completed in her case. So Pope Benedict eliminated any lingering uncertainty by announcing on May 10 that St. Hildegard should be inscribed in the catalogue of saints. The Pope made this announcement as he approved a series of decrees from the Congregation for the Causes of Saints regarding other candidates for beatification and canonization.

St. Hildegard of Bingen (1089-1179) was noted not only as a mystic and theologian but also as a poet, musician, and scientist. In 2010, when he delivered a series of talks on the great thinkers who have shaped the thought of the Church, Pope Benedict devoted two consecutive public audiences to the thought of St. Hildegard of Bingen, noting that her vision was unusually "rich in theological content." The Pope said that the German mystic's keen interest in the sciences was a natural outgrowth of her spirituality, since in her eyes "all of creation was a symphony of the Holy Spirit, Who is in Himself joy and contentment."
