### **2018 CHRISTMAS JOY OFFERING—SUNDAY, DECEMBER 23**

Advent is a time of anticipation and promise, of thanksgiving and celebration. 

## From PROPERTY & STEWARDSHIP COMMITTEES

### BRRRR!!! COLD WEATHER IS HERE!



As we continue our attempt to be good stewards of our resources, the heating temperature is set at 68 degrees throughout the church for the winter months. We realize that we cannot achieve a setting that is ideal for everyone so we are asking that you keep this in mind when dressing for events this winter. There are also blankets available just inside the sanctuary on your right which may be used if needed.

The electric bill is the single largest expense for our church after payroll. We use about 40% of our electric budget from January–March each year. We appreciate your help in keeping these costs as low as possible.

Let's ALL help by reminding and helping each other turn off heaters and lights after Bible studies and meetings. Thank you!

**A Special Note:** Please use ONLY the up and down arrows to adjust the heat, NOT the "HOLD" button! All of the thermostats are painstakingly programmed by one of our church members to turn on and off at specific times, according to scheduled use for worship, meetings, etc. The arrows will adjust the temperature and then automatically resume its programming once that time period is over, but using the "HOLD" button will keep the heat (and AC in the summer) running indefinitely.

Power outages sometimes "upset" the schedule, so if the heat or AC is not running during a scheduled event, please tell Tina in the office so that the thermostat programming can be checked. In the meantime, read the notes attached to the thermostats and use the arrows!

## NOTES ABOUT YEAR-END CONTRIBUTIONS

Here are just a few reminders as you consider your year-end contributions to the church.

- ♦ If possible, please consider fulfilling your “2018” Pledge. To those who have made your 2019 Pledge, thank you for supporting the church and its mission.

- ♦ **All donations must be delivered or mailed (and postmarked) on or before December 31, 2018 in order to receive a charitable tax donation for “2018”.**
- ♦ Checks that are placed in the church offering during the first worship service in 2019 will not qualify for a charitable tax contribution deduction in 2018.
- ♦ However, checks that are written, mailed and postmarked in “2018” will be deductible in 2018 even if not received by the church until 2019. Thank you for your generous gifts to the church,
